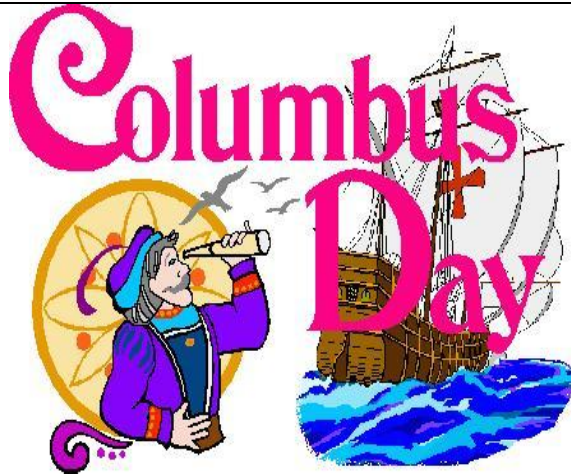

FALL CAR CARE TIPS

Remember the four "B's" when it come to preparing your vehicle for fall.

Blades: Even wiper blades installed in the spring ma need to be replaced. Check for cracks, tears or windshield contact.

Battery: Check battery cables and posts for secure fit or corrosion and clean as necessary.

Brakes: Not only check the brakes for wear but make sure the fluid levels are correct.

Belts & Hoses: Check all engine belts and hoses for cracking and pliability. If the belts are rigid, replace them. Don't get stranded!!
